

THOUSAND OAKS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT REGULAR BOARD MEETING NOVEMBER 14, 2022

A. CALL TO ORDER

The November 14, 2022, Regular Board Meeting of the Thousand Oaks Community Development District (the "District") was called to order at 4:15 p.m. in the Thousand Oaks HOA Office located at 1034 Center Stone Lane, Riviera Beach, Florida 33404.

B. PROOF OF PUBLICATION

Proof of publication was presented that notice of the Regular Board Meeting had been published in *The Palm Beach Post* on September 19, 2022, as part of the District's Fiscal Year 2022/2023 Regular Board Meeting, as legally required.

C. MOMENT OF SILENCE

D. ESTABLISH A QUORUM

A quorum was established by the presence of Chairman Jeff Jackson, Vice Chairman Rance Gaede and Supervisors Malachi Knowles and Horace Towns.

Staff present included District Manager Sylvia Bethel of Special District Services, Inc.; and District Counsel Frank Palen of Caldwell Pacetti Edwards Schoech & Viator LLP.

Also present was Corey Smith.

E. ADDITIONS OR DELETIONS TO THE AGENDA

Mr. Jackson added Appointment of Board Member to the agenda under Item G and Board Member Photos under New Business.

A **motion** was made by Mr. Towns, seconded by Mr. Gaede and unanimously passed approving the additions to the agenda.

F. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA

There were no comments from the public for items not on the agenda.

G. APPOINTMENT OF BOARD MEMBER

Mr. Jackson suggested appointing Corey Smith as a new Board Member.

A **motion** was made by Mr. Gaede, seconded by Mr. Knowles and unanimously passed approving appointment of Corey Smith to Seat # 4, which expires in November 2024.

Ms. Bethel administered the Oath of Office.

H. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. October 4, 2022, Regular Board Meeting

A **motion** was made by Mr. Knowles, seconded by Mr. Towns and passed unanimously approving the October 4, 2022, Regular Board Meeting minutes, as presented.

I. OLD BUSINESS

1. Update on Logos for Shirts

Ms. Bethel advised that Mr. Towns was now in charge of this task and would update the Board. Mr. Towns passed around a few images for the Board to discuss. A lengthy discussion ensued. Mr. Towns will take the suggested ideas and return to the next meeting with images for further review.

2. Update on Funds Owed to HOA Regarding Fence Line Tree Trimming

Mr. Jackson advised that he was awaiting information. He is waiting on the gentleman to put together records for him. Mr. Smith asked for an update on this agenda item and Mr. Jackson gave him an update. Mr. Palen suggested that the Board update the amount of the agreement. Mr. Jackson requested staff to contact Mr. Russ of Russ Total Lawn Maintenance requesting a proposal for the entire fence line to get an idea of the cost.

3. Discussion Regarding ATV Purchase versus Rental

Mr. Jackson voiced his concerns about the John Deere ATV approval and would like the Board to reconsider their decision. The Board agreed and withdrew approval of the John Deere ATV from the last meeting. Mr. Jackson asked the Board to again take a look at other ATVs and collect pictures for discussion at the next meeting.

A **motion** was made by Mr. Gaede, seconded by Mr. Knowles and unanimously passed withdrawing the **motion** made October 4, 2022, approving the ATV purchase of a John Deere Gator XUV590M from John Deere in the amount of \$12,447.96, pending additional information to be gathered from John Deere pertaining to the ATV being street legal and tags and insurance coverage from Special District Services.

4. Update on Newsletter and Website

Mr. Jackson advised that he wanted copies of previous newsletters. Ms. Bethel informed Mr. Jackson that the letters were emailed to him, as requested, but she will resend the newsletters to Mr. Jackson. Mr. Jackson would like to hire someone to spruce up the CDD website. The website should inform the community what the CDD is doing. Messrs. Knowles and Smith agreed. Mr. Smith stated that the website should also inform the community about the differences between the HOA and the CDD. Ms. Bethel advised that Special District Services, Inc. (SDS) manages and maintains their website. Mr. Gaede stated that there were certain ADA requirements that they have to follow on the website and Mr. Palen stated that SDS also keeps the website up to date with compliance. The Board would like to add updates and pictures to the CDD website.

5. Discussion Regarding Midge and Mosquito Treatment Proposal

Ms. Bethel advised that she had followed up with the vendor and this had not yet been completed due to the supply being on backorder. Mr. Jackson stated that if it was not completed by November 30th, to cancel the request.

6. Discussion Regarding District Investment Policy

Mr. Palen advised of investment options. He indicated the Board had several options for investment of "surplus" District funds, which is consistent with Section 218.415, Florida Statutes:

- Leave surplus funds in Hancock Bank, but move them to a higher interest investment authorized by Section 218.415, F.S., or
- Move surplus funds to an entity authorized to manage public funds by Section 218.415, F.S. Such entities include the Florida Local Government Investment Trust or an "intergovernmental investment pool" such as FLCLASS or Florida Fixed Income Investment Trust (FL-FIT). If this option is chosen the District's surplus funds may only be invested in any of four (4) investment categories provided in sec. 218.415(17)(a)-(d), An advantage of this option is that the District can depend on the pool or fund to invest its surplus funds consistent with Chapter 218, F.S. It would not need to assume direct responsibility for investment and no Investment Policy is required. If this option is chosen, the range of permissible investment is limited to four (4) of the eleven (11) categories authorized in the statute.
- Assume direct responsibility for managing surplus funds by adopting an investment policy that conforms with Section 218.415, F.S. The details of the Investment Policy must be "commensurate with the nature and size of the funds within its custody". The Policy must include the fifteen (15) mandatory elements, listed in Section 218.415(1)-(15), Florida Statutes. The Board may then invest its surplus funds in any of eleven (11) designated investment categories.

If the Board chooses to rely on an Investment Policy, it must designate a "responsible official" to manage investment of surplus funds. Ms. Bethel confirmed that SDS does not provide financial advice or financial management services. The Board would therefore have to retain an independent financial manager who satisfies the requirements of Section 218.415. F.S.

A discussion followed regarding the available investment options. The Board saw a presentation at a previous meeting from a representative of FLClass, an intergovernmental investment pool. Ms. Bethel indicated she had solicited interest by other designated "investment pools," but they had either not responded or expressed no interest.

After discussion, the Board decided to solicit a responsible, independent financial manager. Mr. Knowles mentioned the Gehring Group as a possibility and strongly suggested that the Board consider this company as an investment manager. The Board agreed and Mr. Knowles agreed to arrange a presentation by the Gehring Group.

Mr. Palen provided the Board with a draft Investment Policy for consideration at its next meeting

Ms. Bethel advised about Hancock Bank's interest rate of 2.50% on a money market fund.

A **motion** was made by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Towns and unanimously passed approving all surplus funds immediately being moved into a Money Market account at 2.50% at Hancock Bank, provided that there would be no penalty if the funds were withdrawn within 60 days. The Board asked that such assurance be confirmed by the Bank in writing.

7. Consider New Fountain Proposal

Ms. Bethel advised that this was placed back on the agenda because they were awaiting the electrician's proposal, which is located on Page 19 of the meeting booklet. The Board reviewed the item.

A **motion** was made by Mr. Gaede, seconded by Mr. Knowles and unanimously passed approving the Palm Beach Aquatics proposal for two new fountains in the amount of \$25,340 and for Banner Electric, Inc. to run electricity for the new fountains at a cost of \$7,500, pending legal review.

8. Discussion Regarding Board Member Inquiry on Serving in Dual Offices

Ms. Bethel advised that the Board had requested that this item be placed back on the agenda to address any further questions, if there were any from the Board. Mr. Palen briefly went over the details and the Board had no further questions.

9. Discussion Regarding FASD Conference

Ms. Bethel advised that the Board had requested that this item be brought back with the dates of next conference. The next conference is scheduled for January 19th -20th in Jacksonville. The Board suggested making a motion pursuant to the travel policy. Upon registration opening, staff can register members in a timely manner.

A **motion** was made by Mr. Knowles, seconded by Mr. Gaede and unanimously passed approving staff to contact and register Board Members who would like to attend the FASD Conference in Jacksonville from January 19-20, 2023.

J. NEW BUSINESS

1. Discussion Regarding Landscaping Increase

Ms. Bethel advised that the landscape contract for Villa Rosa was increasing as of January 2023 from \$1,100 to \$1,155. Mr. Gaede suggested getting a proposal from Russ Total Lawn Maintenance, LLC. He also stated that the increase from Terracon was not bad, but it would be nice to have one vendor take care of the entire property. Staff will obtain a proposal for review at the next meeting.

2. Board Member Photos

Mr. Jackson stated he would like to compensate Mr. Knowles' wife for her work and time for taking Board Member photos. He feels that \$200 would be a good compensation. Mr. Palen stated that Mr. Knowles cannot vote on this matter, due to a conflict of interest. He must file a form 8B regarding this item.

A **motion** was made by Mr. Gaede, seconded by Mr. Towns approving a \$200 compensation to Mrs. Knowles for taking the Board Member photos. Upon being put to a vote, the **motion** carried 4 to 0 with Mr. Knowles abstaining from the vote.

K. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

There were no Administrative Matters to come before the Board.
